CLINICAL FIELD REFERENCE

FOUR POINTS TO UNDERSTAND

1

DIAGNOSIS AND PATHWAY

The current diagnosis and direct, secondary, aggravation, or continuity theory are clearly identified.

2

ATTACK RECORD

Frequency, duration, symptoms, prostration, and recovery are documented across several months.

3

FUNCTIONAL EVIDENCE

Lay, medical, and work evidence describe what stops during attacks and the resulting disruption.

4

CONSISTENT SUBMISSION

The claim, log, treatment notes, examination history, and medical opinion use accurate, reconcilable facts.

Apply the current regulation and case law to the individual record. Attack frequency, severity, duration, and functional impact should be documented accurately and consistently.
